Guardians report harassment, threats at HA school

The guardians of two Hoopeston Area Middle School students spoke at Thursday's school board meeting, questioning disciplinary measures at the school.

Ralph and Patsy Johnson told board members that their nieces are harassed and physically threatened by a group of five girls and that principal John Burkey has done little to keep the children safe.

The girls, who are handicapped, are in self-contained classrooms except during lunch and physical education class, Mrs. Johnson said. That is when the girls are allegedly taunted and pushed.

Mrs. Johnson said talks from Burkey have not stopped the harassment. "The girls didn't listen," she said. "If the children at school don't listen to his authority, if his authority is nothing, then why is he there?"

Mrs. Johnson portrayed the girls as traumatized by the behavior, saying one becomes withdrawn.

Teacher Barb Park, who has that girl four of eight periods, disagreed. "I don't see a traumatized, unhappy girl," she said. "This person you describe as afraid to come to school, I don't see."

Burkey defended his position, saying he has warned the students to leave the girls alone.

Some incidents reported by Mrs. Johnson were reported by another student, but Superintendent Don Dean dismissed student reports. "If a student said your niece pushed someone," he asked, "what would you do? I know what you'd do."

Board member Gary Miller said the board will investigate the complaint.

In other action, the board:

- ☐ approved the 1995-96 budget of \$6.3 million in revenue and \$7.4 million in expenses.
- ☐ approved high school secretary Winona Sheridan's resignation.
- ☐ changed early dismissal times from 1:10 for grade schools and 1:30 for high and middle schools to 2:05 and 2:25, respectively.
