

Finance meeting set to work out landfill compromise

The city of Hoopeston's finance committee is expected to meet at 7:30 p.m. Thursday to discuss possible compromises between Illinois Landfills Inc. and its opponents.

The finance committee was appointed Sept. 19 by Mayor Bob Ault to help both sides reach a compromise on a proposed 120-acre addition to the existing landfill.

Thursday's meeting is expected to be conducted primarily behind closed doors, said city attorney Jim Spiros, saying the meeting will deal with pending litigation against the city.

The city, along with Illinois Landfills Inc. is named in an appeal to the Illinois Pollution Control Board of the June 1995 city council decision reaffirming the expansion, Spiros said. "It's an active case and clearly an exception to the Open Meetings Act," Spiros said. "We're entitled to (discuss litigation) behind closed doors."

The Open Meetings Act is Illinois law stipulating when government agencies may and may not conduct closed-door meetings. The host agreement spells out what the city will receive if the expansion is granted. The original version, approved on Sept. 27, 1992, includes how much money the city will receive from Illinois Landfills Inc.' in host fees. The agreement also makes the landfill company responsible for maintaining what is commonly called "hospital road," the route to the landfill.

The existing document also freezes Hoopeston garbage pick-up rates for 10 years, guarantees the city 20 years of landfill space and states the landfill company will operate a community recyclingcenter.

The document may have to be modified if compromises are reached.

Opponents want a different route to the landfill, one that does not go by Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital or Hoopeston Area High School. Opponents would also like to cut the number of counties from which the landfill will accept waste.


