Idea for Halloween house haunts Hoopeston Jaycees

The Hoopeston Jaycees are looking for ghouls and goblins to make this year's Halloween activities frightfully successful.

The group wants to have a haunted house for Halloween, said Jaycee president Don Kaeb. But that won't happen unless civic groups and businesses get involved.

"We aren't going to do the haunted house unless we get six organizations," Kaeb said. Organizations, such as sororities, fraternities or other civic groups - along with businesses - are needed to fill rooms at the haunted house.

Jaycees would build the 10-room maze, but groups would be responsible for selecting a theme for their room, decorating it appropriately and supplying manpower for it.



Hoopeston police officer tells group about cult activities

"If the world had a front porch, your neighbors would be your best friends" could be a motto for an ideal world, but crime, drugs and other problems make the world far from ideal.

That is why the Neighborhood Watch group was formed and meets monthly.

The group met Monday night to hear Hoopeston police officer Roger Beaty speak on cults.

Beaty said there are no organized local cults, but that some children dabble in satanic activity. This, he said, can be more dangerous than actual cult activity because children will go on crime sprees to get money for drugs. This can sometimes lead to murder, he said.

Volunteers would be needed Oct. 27-31, Kaeb said. The house would be open from 7-10 p.m. weeknights and 7-11 p.m. weekends and Halloween night, he said.

It has been approximately two years since the Jaycees sponsored a haunted house, Kaeb said, adding the project was dropped both because it was difficult to find people to man the house and because area residents did not support it.

If enough organizations are found to man the house, it will be located in the building next to Penicook Insurance in the 200 block of South Market.

Groups interested in volunteering for the project should call Kaeb at (217) 283-6609, Cliff Crabtree, 283-9670 or Sarah Miller, 283-6786. Deadline for volunteering is Oct. 4.
