## Allied Waste Industries purchases Danville landfill

The owners of the Illinois Landfills Inc. site in Hoopston have purchased a nearby landfill and solid waste disposal company.

Allied Waste Industries, parent company of Illinois Landfills, purchased Brickyard Disposal and Recycling of Danville, effective Oct. 1.

The business had been owned by Danville businessman Lou Mervis.

The buyout does not mean a requested 120-acre expansion of the Hoopston site will be dropped, said Jim Van Weelden, Allied vice president. "We never felt there was pressure to expand (the Hoopston site) before," Van Weelden said. "It was a business decision and we're going ahead with it."

The acquisition will not cause changes at either the Illinois Landfills site or Brickyard, Van Weelden said. "Management will stay the same in both," he said.

The Brickyard landfill sits approximately 100 acres, compared to the local 35-acre site.

Allied Waste Industries is headquartered in Scottsdale, AZ. The company operates 30 solid waste collection companies, 17 landfills, six recycling centers and 20 transfer stations in ten states.

As the transition is made, Illinois Landfills Inc. officials continue to meet with local anti-expansionists to hammer out a compromise agreement.

The major points of contention include the route trucks will take to the landfill and the number of counties which would be served by an expanded site.

Opponents object to trucks going past Hoopston Community Memorial Hospital and want landfill officials to trim the list of 31 counties in Illinois and Indiana which would be served if the expansion is allowed.

Talks continue despite an appeal to the Illinois Pollution Control Board. Landfill officials, opponents and the city finance committee met Oct. 6 but no agreement was reached.
