Company reports good start despite recent lay-offs

A local plant is losing workers and equipment in what managers say is part of the original operating plan.

Hoopeston Foods, Inc., recently laid off approximately 20 workers, with another 12 workers expected to be laid off in the near future, said plant manager Roger Bundy.

Hoopeston Foods purchased the former Pillsbury building in July. Pillsbury had sold local operations to Seneca Foods, which planned to close the Hoopeston plant.

The lay-offs are "part of the original purchase agreement," Bundy said.

Before opening the plant, Hoopeston Foods president John Steel estimated 50 of Pillsbury's

more than 200 workers would be hired. Because of a co-pack contract with Pillsbury, Hoopeston Foods was able to keep on approximately 100 workers.

However, Bundy said the Pillsbury agreement is ending, forcing the company to close two production lines. The lay-offs will leave the company's workforce at about 70 people, approximately 20 more than the original estimate.

Hoopeston Foods has bid on other business, including work for the U.S. Department of Agricul-

Hunter safety course set

Area residents will have an opportunity to learn basic principles of safe hunting at a Department of Conservation hunter safety education course.

State law requires all hunters under age 16 successfully complete the course before receiving their first hunting license.

The 10-hour course includes instructions in wildlife management, firearms safety, hunter ethics, game identification, first aid, survival techniques and regulations.

"The intention is to buy some of it back," Bundy said, adding company officials hope to add at least one of the two lost production lines.

The slowdown comes during what is usually the busiest season for canning beans. "This is the good part of business for beans," Bundy said, because canners are usually canning winter bean products, including chili. "This is generally the high point."

Despite the lay-offs and equipment loss, Bundy said the plant is in healthy shape. "We're really doing quite well," he said, adding in three months, Hoopeston Foods has produced 800,000 cases of beans. "We're pretty well tracking right where we're supposed to be according to the business plan."
