

Indian, pioneer lifestyles featured at area fall festival

ROSSVILLE—Family entertainment from days gone by will be featured at the Rossville Fall Festival this weekend.

The event, scheduled from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, will feature Indian and pioneer displays, as well as a flea market, antiques and crafts said Tony McKinley of the Rossville Merchants Association.

The Rossville Merchants Association, in coniunction with the Progressive Merchants Association, sponsors the festival.

One block of Attica St., directly off Chicago St., will be closed for the festival. McKinley said. Vendors of merchandise and food will sell their wares along the street. Village shops will also be open.

Featured this year will be an Indian village dis-

play, Indian and pioneer folklore and Tawoskote pioneer arms and craftsmen, complete with blacksmith, McKinley said.

Paul Quick will host story time for children at 10:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. both days, and the Kickapoo Sidekicks will perform and host street line dancing from 2:30-4 p.m. Saturday. At approximately 2 p.m. Sunday, the Sweet Adelines are scheduled to perform.

This is the festival's sixth year, McKinley said. It had been held at the end of October, closer to Halloween, but "the weather was never permitting," he said.

Crowds have grown over the years, but McKinley is not sure how many people attend. "I know we get bunches of people," he said. "It could be hundreds, it could be thousands."


Correction
