

New Rossville trustee named, animal policy examined

ROSSVILLE—A new trustee took his place on the Rossville village board Monday night.

Richard Comstock was appointed to the board, replacing Sherry Ray, who resigned Aug. 7.

"I want to serve the community," Comstock said after the meeting. "I want to do what the people want me to do. The encouragement I got from the community is what brought me here."

Comstock was born and raised in Hoopeston and left the area in 1958 when he joined the Navy. He lived in California until June 1994 when he moved to Rossville.

When Ray resigned, she suggested Rossville resident Eva Neeland be named to replace her, but Mayor Mery Smith decided not to follow that suggestion. "I thought this gentleman would do a better job," he said. "He's a native but he's been gone a while so maybe we'll get a fresh perspective on

Trustee Mick Braddock abstained on the vote. "I'm going to abstain because I don't know you," he told Comstock. "If you're good enough for them, you'll be good enough for me."

In other business, Jerry Hawker, Vermilion County animal control officer, explained a \$50 bill from his office to the village.

Hawker said village residents brought two or three animals to the county shelter, saving the animals were strays. The county then charged the village \$50 as an impounding fee.

The village currently has a contract with Dr. Tom Maudlin of Hoopeston for animal control services, but Hawker said the county "would like to have your business back."

mal. The village's contract with Maudlin's office ends Jan. 15, 1996.

County rates are \$93.75 for up to seven animals, then \$10 for every additional animal; \$62.50 for up to five animals; and \$31.25 for basic service with a \$10 fee per animal.

Trustee Richard Kiser said the village stopped using county services when the rates were increased because the village often had no animals picked up. "A hundred dollars a month - that's to much for an empty hotel room," he said.

However, Hawker said one of the major points for using county facilities is that people may adopt

animals more easily if they are not claimed. "We have posted hours for adoption," he said. "I don't know what the set-up is in Hoopeston."
