City committee to study requested parking changes

City officials plan to study requested changes in parking spaces throughout Hoopston.

Mark Drollinger, chairman of the city's street and alley committee, discussed two proposed changes at Tuesday's Hoopston city council meeting.

The first proposal is to create a second handicapped parking space in front of Weber Drugs, 221 E. Main.

The store is expanding into the building adjacent to it and a second space is needed, Drollinger said.

A second request came from Hoopston Foods Inc., to eliminate or restrict five parking spaces on

the east side of First Ave. and Penn St., allowing trucks easier access to loading docks.

The street and alley committee will study the proposals and make a recommendation to the council.




