Hoopeston Area enrollment drops for second year

Decreasing enrollment may mean future problems for the Hoopeston Area school district.

Figures released at Thursday's school board meeting show enrollment on Sept. 29 at 1,692, down from 1,748 last year and 1,783 the previous year.

The Sept. 29 figure, called the fall housing total, determines the amount of state aid the district will receive, said Supt. Don Dean. The loss of approximately 80 students from last year means a loss of approximately \$160,000 in state funds, he added.

"Generally, falling enrollment is something that can cripple a school district," Dean said, adding Hoopeston Area is "in good shape" right now because of recent additions of students from Wellington and Rankin. However, "if that trend were to continue, obviously, any district would be concerned," he said.

In other business, the board:

□employed Joyce Cottingham as a personal aide; Diana Decker as high school office clerk; and Margaret Morgan, high school EMH/LD teacher pending proper certification.

discussed a summary of the state report card, which Dean said shows the district doing well. District report cards will be sent home Oct. 27.

□set Nov. 2-3 as parent/teacher conference days in the district.
