Driver, passenger injured, police say drugs involved

A Hoopeston girl remains hospitalized following an accident at 8:26 p.m. Sunday.

Brooke E. Malchow, 16, of 309 E. Chestnut, was listed in good condition Monday afternoon at Carle Foundation Hospital.

Malchow and Shane York, 19, were injured when Malchow reportedly lost control of her 1987 Oldmobile and struck a utility pole at 706 N. Market.

York was treated and released from Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.

Malchow was ticketed for driving under the influence of cannabis, no seat belt and improper lane usage.

York was cited for not wearing a seat belt.

A third person, Jose A. Cardenas, 20, of Hoopeston, was ticketed for possession of cannabis and was released on a notice to appear.

Preliminary report card good

Preliminary figures show Hoopeston Area schools meeting or exceeding most standards for the state report card.

A report card summary shows HA schools are at or above state averages in sixth, eighth and 10th grade reading; third, sixth and eighth grade math; third, sixth and 10th grade writing; fourth, seventh and 11th grade science; and seventh and 11th grade social science.

Students are below state averages in third grade reading, 10th grade math, eighth grade writing and fourth grade social science.

Additionally, the district spends less than average per pupil, at \$4,050, compared with a state average of \$5,705 and \$4,275 for schools of similar size.

Report cards will be available to the public on Oct. 27.

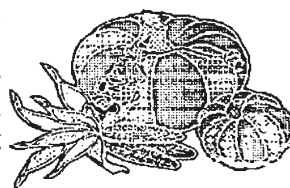
Entries - with the recipe included - will be accepted at the tent from 11 a.m. to noon.
