

Newcomers hope to land seats on Hoopeston Area school board

Editor's note: This is the first in a series on the eight candidates running in the Nov. 7 election for Hoopeston Area school board seats.

Contessa "Connie" Wilson has two reasons to run for the Hoopeston Area school board; her children.

Wilson, 31, has two daughters, ages 10 and 5, in Hoopeston schools. While her job as pharmacy manager at Walgreen's in Danville prohibits her from getting involved in her children's school life through being a room mother, Wilson said a seat on the board would not only fit her schedule, but allow her to have input to her children's education. "I'm trying to stay in touch with my children and the decisions that will be affecting their lives," she said.

Another incentive to run is experience she got on at Purdue University, srving on the curriculum committee. "That's where I got my first interest," she said. The interest was furthered in New York, participating in a joint decision-making committee, which worked on everything from changing the school's grading system to "deciding which weeds needed to be whacked."

Wilson sees many strengths in the district and few weaknesses.

Among the strengths are the availability of computers to students throughout their education. "they have done very well in keeping the children up in those kinds of things," Wilson said.

Another strength is "consolidation efforts" with other schools.

Wilson said she is unaware of any problems "that have been a faltering concern."

Describing herself as "pretty conservative," Wilson said she will speak her mind if elected. "I will not hide how I feel about something," she said.

Wilson is a member of the Illinois Pharmacists Association and helps at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital. She and her family attend Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

Wilson has lived in Hoopeston for approximately 10 years.

A second candidate also cites his children as reasons for seeking a board seat.
