## Hoopeston Area High School junior qualifies for state meet

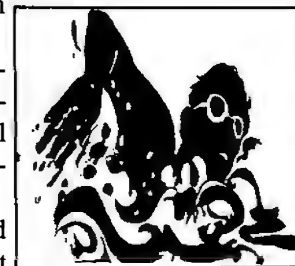
Hoopeston Area High School's lone swimmer at Saturday's IHSA swimming sectionals has qualified for state competition in two events.

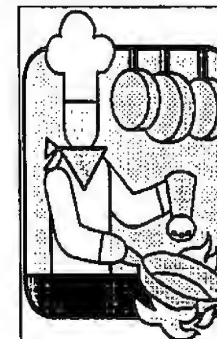
