## 'Rethinking caring' key to street safety says local expert

Street safety comes, not from brute strength, but from "rethinking your caring," according to a local self-defense expert.

Bill and Susan McGee, black belt instructors at Hoopeston's Karate Club, presented the program at Monday's Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Being safe does not mean not being nice, but being more assertive, Bill McGee said. "I guarantee you, every kid whose picture is on a milk carton tried to be nice to someone," he said.

Rethinking being nice means, for example, that if a stranger comes to the door, saying there is an emergency, the smart - and safe - resident will offer to call for help but not allow the person in the house.

When dealing with an attacker, at least one of three things should be taken away from him: his sight, breath or mobility, McGee said. Suggestions included scratching or gouging the eyes to take away sight, hitting the nose or solar plexus to remove breath and a swift kick to the knee to impair mobil-

McGee listed four "basics of street smarts," includ-

- 1.) Use available light. Park and walk in lighted
- 2.) Go with the flow. When in a crowd, such as at a concert, leave when others do.
- 3.) Be aware of your surroundings. Bad guys are not always in bushes, McGee said. They are often looking for those who are preoccupied.
- 4.) decrease your worth as a victim. This includes not wearing fine jewelry to shop and not pulling out large amounts of money.

McGee said carrying pepper spray is helpful and that women should remember "sometimes the safest place is under a car."

The time to act is when first accosted, "Never let anyone take you to the second scene," McGee said,

adding Karate Club students are taught the 20 Percent rule. Only 20 percent of the time does someone with a gun actually shoot it. Of those, only 20 percent of shots will hit, Of the ones which hit, only 20 percent will be deadly.

Self defense is especially important for children, because one of every four girls and one of every nine boys will be sexually assaulted by the time they are 18, McGee said.

And while mothers have warned daughters to strike attackers in the groin area, that is the best idea. "It's a pretty small area," McGee said. "I would

go after his knee. Even if he's on drugs and doesn't feel it, it will affect his mobility."

The McGees, and students Mark Huckleby, Sara Watts and Monica Halley also demonstrated basic moves to get away from an attacker.

Safety is each person's responsibility, McGee said. "There aren't enough policemen to stand in every doorway, to be in every car," he said.

From a legal aspect, McGee said people have the right to defend themselves. "I'd rather be put away by 12 of my peers than by six of my friends," he said. "I'd rather take my chances with a good lawyer than a good doctor in an emergency room."

Self defense classes are available at the Karate Club each Saturday from 9-10:30 a.m., McGee said.

The next Neighborhood Watch program will be at 7 p.m. Jan. 22. Hoopeston police officer Chuck Moyer will give the program.
