

City council approves slight increase in 1995-96 tax levy

Hoopeston's 1995-96 tax levy will increase by only .08 percent.

Aldermen passed the 403,804 levy at Tuesday's city council meeting.

The levy, based on an assessed valuation of \$23,029,384, reflects a 17 percent decrease in the amount payed for unemployment compensation insurance, down from \$22,500 to \$18,700 annually, said alderman Bill Goodwine, chairman of the city finance committee.

Four significant areas showed increases, Goodwine said. They include Social Security taxes, up 3.3 percent to \$50,500; police pension fund, up 46 percent, from \$6,115 to \$8,694; liability insurance, up 1.3 percent, to \$73,717; and workmen's compensation, up 10 percent, to \$31,593.

The increases were dictated by state-mandated increases, Goodwine said. In other business, alderman Drew Allen said improvements in the city's drinking water will not be seen until after the new year.

Improvements at the water treatment plan began last summer and were to be completed by now, said Allen, chairman of the city water/sewer committee.

However, a delay getting the panel board which will control the automatic monitoring system has pushed back the completion date.

The panel board is expected to be delivered in early January, Allen said.

While unhappy with the delay, Allen said some good has come from it. Since the system has not been installed, a new, updated computer will be included at no extra cost to the city.

In other business, alderman Mike Eckersley, parks committee chairman, said new doors will soon be installed at the McFerren Park civic center.
