Citizen complaints result in Rossville meter reading change

ROSSVILLE—Resident complaints about high water bills prompted a special meeting of and action by the Rossville village board Tuesday night.

Trustees voted to have water meters read monthly by village employees, instead of having meters read every six months and estimating usage other months. said Mayor Merv Smith.

Estimates were based on last year's use plus 10 percent, he said. However, in some cases, landlords were paying water usage based on a large family of tenants last year, while the family had moved and a single person was occupying the building, using significantly less water.

Additionally, a water rate increase, approved in June, was reflected in recent bills. Trustees approved an increase from \$3.06 to \$4.10 per 1,000 gallons used. "It kind of hit them all at once," Smith said.

For those whose bills are exorbitant, trustee Tom Mills, village water/sewer committee chairman, will analyze bills and make adjustments, if necessary.

Also, Smith said residents will be given several months if paying at once is a problem. Late fees will not be added to payment plans.

"We're doing that in the spirit of Christmas," Smith said, "We're not taking anybody's Christmas money away from them."

Friends of Library offer commemorative Christmas ornament


Well-dressed local Christmas trees will be wearing a special ornament this year.

Food for fines


The Hoopeston Public Library is offering "Food For Fines" during December.
