Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce offers discount cards

A new Chamber of Commerce promotion will allow area residents to spend \$5 to save an almost unlimited amount of money.

The Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce is offering a discount card, good at 15 Hoopeston businesses, said Kim Seggebruch, a member of the Chamber committee responsible for the card.

Card purchasers can "save an unlimited amount" at participating businesses "depending on how many times a year you use it," Seggebruch said.

Card sales will not only benefit purchasers, but also the Chamber, which will receive approximately \$2 per card sold, after expenses, Seggebruch said. Participating businesses will also benefit. "It's another way to keep business here in town," she said.

Unlike previous discount cards marketed by the Chamber, this one will not be sold through

telemarketers. "We feel it's a nice enough value that people will come to us and we won't have to pester people with telemarketing," Seggebruch said.

The plastic cards are available at the Hoopeston Chamber of Commerce office, 211 S. Market, and at local businesses.

Although a goal has not been set, the Chamber hopes to sell 1,000 cards. Profits will be used for local events and promotions, Seggebruch said.

Participating businesses include McDonald's, Pizza Station, DCH Photography, Parkview Lanes, Burger King, Lorraine Theatre, Subway, SARAH'S Fitness Center, Yergler Jewelers, Big A Auto, Terminix, Wayne's World, Pizza Hut, Global Fashions and Flowers and Gifts by Molly Culbert.

Postal workers to collect more than mail during food

Drive to benefit local food cupboard

For the second consecutive year, local postal workers hope to collect more than they deliver during a scheduled food drive.

Members of the National Association of Letter Carriers, with the cooperation of the U.S. Postal Service, and local United Way agencies will conduct a national food drive on Saturday, May 11.

Local postal carriers will get in on the act, picking up items left by mailboxes, said Hoopeston postal worker Ray Rice.

The drive is focusing on non-perishables, such as canned food, as well as toiletries, such as soap and shampoo, and paper products.

All items collected will be weighed, then donated to the Grant Township Food Cupboard. "It's staying right here in the community," Rice said. "(The food cupboard) is going to have volunteers down there putting it away as fast as we can bring it in," Rice said.

This is the second year local postal workers have joined the national campaign. Last year's drive netted approximately 2,600 pounds of products donated. "We're hoping to break that this year," Rice said.

The May drive was started to help food pantries whose supplies dwindle at this time of year. "This has, historically, been a low time of year for them," Rice said. "They get a lot of donations between Thanksgiving and Christmas, but by summer, they seem to be low."

A collection point will also be available at the post office for customers to drop off items, Rice said.


