### Man withdraws apartment plan, will submit second plan

ROSSVILLE—A request for a senior citizen apartment complex has been withdrawn by the man who wants to build it.

At a special village board meeting Tuesday, Mick Duckett withdrew a plan for a 12-unit apartment building. He will submit a new plan to the village zoning board at 7:30 p.m. Thursday. That meeting will be followed at 8:30 p.m. by another special village board meeting.

Duckett countered concerns expressed by some residents. In a prepared packet, Duckett included a letter from Kenneth Cuningham, a Danville real estate

appraiser, which stated surrounding property values would not be affected by the complex.

The packet also included a letter from Tilton mayorConrad Wantland praising a similar complex Duckett built in that community.

Duckett said the building will be solely for those over age 55, although no written rule on the age limit will be given due to discrimination laws. "I'd be cutting my own throat if I put eight seniors in and a young family," Duckett said.

If Duckett gets approval for the project, he expects it to be completed within 150 days.

## It may be wet, but not as wet as it should be: weather recorder

It may seem like all it does is rain, but according to Hoopeston weather reporter John Mushrush, the first four months of this year have been dry.

The Hoopeston area has received 4.48 fewer incheas of rain than normal. Monthly totals thus far are January, 1.3", Feb., .52, March, 1.19 and April 2.38, for a total of 5.39", down from the average 9.57". "We've got quite a bit of catching up to do," Mushrush said.


