## Hoopeston Area High School to start television station

Hoopeston Area school students could become television stars next fall.

Hoopeston Area High School and Hoopeston Cable T.V. are launching a joint venture that will allow the school to have its own television station.

The station, which will be on channel 41, will serve as a message center for school activities and emergency announcements, as well as broadcasting school-related activities, said Dan Reed, high school media teacher.

The school district has spent between \$8,000 and \$9,000 on equipment, Superintendent Don Dean said at last Thursday's school board meeting.

Reed said equipment ordered includes a software package with cartooning and animation capabilities, as well as various backgrounds and sound effects.

While the message format will be similar to that offered by Hoopeston Cable on channel 4, "ours if plain Jane," said cable manager Monique Lusk. "This

is going to be dynamic."

The quality of programming will be similar to high definition television, cable technician John Stewart added.

As part of an agreement with the cable company, the school will provide three to four hours of video programming each month. Possibilities include graduation and grade school programs and skits. "Parents don't get to see these because they're during the day," Reed said.

Other possibilities include tape-delay broadcasts of sporting events, a sports wrap-up with school coaches, programs focusing on different high school departments and new teachers, concerts and a student-produced news program, complete with sets.

Some programming from Danville Area Community College, such as course offerings and schedules, will also be used, Reed said.

Early programming will be taped. As students - and Reed - become more proficient with the system, live broadcasts may be added.

The station will be available to Hoopeston Cable customers in Hoopeston, Wellington and Milford, but not Rossville, Lusk said.

While school ends this week, Reed will be involved over the summer not only learning the system, but also learning what the school can and cannot air. "I'm getting a book on (Federal Communications Commission rules and regulations," he said.

A television station is something Hoopeston Cable and the school have discussed several years ago, Reed said. When the company decided to upgrade equipment, both decided the time was right. "It'll be an advantage to the community," Lusk said.
