**Unabomber case will not be similar to OJ's: local attorney**

Prosecutors are building a case against suspected Unabomber Theodore J. Kaczynski, but I suspect this case will not play out like another notorious case without eyewitnesses: the trial of O.J. Simpson. The difference? Instead of relying on complicated DNA evidence, the most compelling evidence in this case may be an old-fashioned, low tech typewriter.

While the jury must trust scientific explanations to understand DNA evidence, it can see for itself how a typewriter works. Had Kaczynski used a laser printer, this type of evidence would not be available.

Kaczynski's isolated cabin held a treasure trove of evidence, according to the FBI. More than 600 items were found, including bombs, bomb making equipment, and a sweatshirt and sunglasses similar to those in the famous sketch of the suspect. Prosecutors are expected to use this evidence, along with the typewriter, to link Kaczynski to the various crimes.

The printing characteristics of a typewriter seized from Kaczynski's mountain cabin match the type of a 35,000 word Unabomber manifesto. Prosecutors expect the comparisons to be graphically powerful.

Kaczynski, 53, is suspected of carrying out 16 mail bombs killing three and wounding 23 others over a period of 17 years.
