Long-time minister leaving church, city with fond memories

After approximately 1,200 sermons, more than 750 funerals, and nearly 700 weddings, the Rev. Wheeler T. Harden is leaving the pulpit.

Harden -"W.T.," as he is called - will preach his last sermon at Hoopeston's First Christian Church on Aug. 11, ending 23 years of ministering to the 570-member congregation.

This will be the second time Harden and his wife, Annette, have said good-bye to Hoopeston. Harden, who became a minister in 1956, first came to Hoopeston in 1963 and spent five years at the church.

He left in 1968, to minister in Ohio, but returned in August 1978. "We've liked the community," he said. "Obviously, because we've come back and stayed around."

Harden plans to spend the first several months of retirement catching up on family activities, visiting his children and having them visit him. He and his wife also plan to travel. "After 40 years, I'm ready to take an extended vacation - even if it's only for three months," he said.

However, Harden plans to continue ministry work, albeit on a smaller scale. "I'd like to be a minister of visitation" to hospitals and nursing homes, he said. Another option is to be in the supply ministry, filling in for vacationing pastors or serving as an interim pastor at different churches.

The idea to enter the ministry came after Harden served in the Korean Conflict. A bombardier/navigator during the war, "I thought rather than drop bombs on people, it would be better to help them," he said.

Harden considered becoming a teacher, but ended up a preacher instead. "Maybe my preaching has been teaching," he said.

Through 23 years of ministering in Hoopeston, Harden has developed lasting relationships spanning four generations. 'The people I married in the 1960s, I'm now marrying their children in the 80s and 90s," he said. "It's a different kind of ministry than if you're only there five years."

It is not only at the church that Harden has gotten involved with the community. He has belonged to the Migrant Council, Hoopeston Masonic Lodge, Grant Township United Way and Hoopeston Rotary. "I had a hard time saying no," he said, laughing.

He is also a member of the Hoopeston Ministerial Association, serving four two-year terms as president.

Approximately two years ago, Harden's activity in Hoopeston was honored with a place in the "Hoopeston Hall of Fame." He has also been voted "most-influential person in Hoopeston."

The activities have kept Harden busy, attending meetings five or six nights each week. "That's one thing I will look forward to: being at home," he said.

Through his 40 years of service, Harden has combined a desire to do God's work with a sense of humor. Contemplating the number of funerals he has performed, he said "I've buried a good-sized town."

People have been the center of Harden's work. "I enjoy doing the work of the ministry, visiting and preaching and sharing with people in their need. I've enjoyed dealing with people whether it's (in the church), on the street or in the coffee shop."

There are several things Harden and Annette will miss when he leaves. "We'll miss the children," he said. "We don't have any grandchildren yet so it's been a real joy to be with the children here."

He will also miss the planning that goes into making a church run smoothly.

But mostly, it will be members of the congregation that he will miss. "I go away with some very, very pleasant memories of Hoopeston," he said.


