# Rural Hoopeston man injured Friday in accident near Wellington

A rural Hoopeston man remains in Carle Foundation Hospital, Urbana, following a twovehicle accident Friday morning.

David Dixon, 47, was stabilized at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital, then transferred to Carle, where he underwent surgery Saturday for a broken back and arm, said Dixon's daughter, Jennifer Dixon.

Dixon remains in intensive care while doctors monitor a breathing problem caused by a collapsed lung, but "his spirits are good," Dixon said.

According to Iroquois County Sheriff's Police, Dixon was injured in rural Wellington. He was travelling on county road 2600E when his vehicle was hit by one driven by Gary Trimmell, 51, of rural Hoopeston, who was westbound on county road 100N.

Trimmell, and a passenger in Dixon's vehicle, Chad Dickison, 20, of Alvin, were treated and released from Hoopeston Community Memorial

The girl was released to an adult relative.


**Two men were arrested** at 8:32 p.m. Saturday, following a citizen complaint of people throwing empty beer bottles.
