Hoopeston beats statistics on domestic abuse: advocate

Hoopeston beats the statistics when it comes to women getting beaten in relationships.

That was the message from Ann Martin, local advocate for the YWCA's Domestic Abuse Program and shelter.

Hoopeston has "one of the highest percentages of domestic violence, Martin told those attending Monday's Neighborhood Watch meeting. "That's sort of overwhelming."

Martin handles 80 to 100 cases annually and "for every hundred cases, there are 400 not reported," she said. "I get called when it gets reported to the police or when someone goes to the emergency room."

Martin explained why women stay with abusive partners. Upper class women are afraid to lose the financial security they have come to have, she said. "(Leaving) could tear down that environment.

Women in lower income brackets fear leaving

because of low self esteem or lower economic prospects. "The woman may not have a job and there's usually only one car," Martin said. "There may be three or four mouths to feed and (the woman) doesn't know how she'll do it."

Some women of all economic levels stay in abusive relationships "because she feels it's better for the kids," Martin

Neighborhood Watch members can help the domestic abuse problem by taking classes at the YWCA, Martin said. Those who cannot attend classes can help by talking to women they suspect are abused, urging them to get help and get out.

Also, she said, Watch members can support children in abusive families, acting as grandparental figures. "Children are the innocent victims in this," she said.



place for an abused woman. "It's not safe," she said, adding that people should instead call the police, the women's shelter in Danville or Martin.
