Police arrest three for break-in at pool concessions stand

Three people were arrested Wednesday in connection with an attempted burglary at the Hoopeston swimming pool concessions stand.

Arrested were Jamie McCarty, 17, of 709 S. Market; Michael A. Trautvetter, 19, no address given; and

Former principal tapped as new Multi Agency executive director

You might say Chalmers Flint got tired of retirement.

Flint, who retired as principal of John Greer Grade School in 1994, came out of retirement to become executive director of the Hoopeston Multi Agency Service Center/Community Center.

Flint began his duties at the information and referral agency on June 17.

Agency secretary Susan Redden "got the ball rolling," Flint said. "She'd say 'you'd do a good job up there.' She did that for about three weeks and finally, I thought 'Hmm.'"

Flint is familiar with the agency, having done volunteer work there. Also, his wife, Carol, has served on the group's board of directors since 1982.

She resigned her post when Flint was hired.

Flint was selected from approximately 20 applicants, said Rod Burkett, agency board president, adding Flint was chosen because of his management skills and his "ability to get different people in different agencies to gel and work together."

Burkett also praised Flint's ability to work with all ages of people, from youth to senior citizens and his dedication. "We knew he would not take this job without being really committed," Burkett said. "We felt that Chalmers would hit the ground running - and he has."

Flint's educational background is well-suited to the position. He has a bachelor's degree in psychology with a minor in sociology and a Master's degree in guidance counseling. "I've been told it was tailor-made for this,"

he said.

While getting his feet wet with daily operations, and trying to find funding for practical items, such as a new roof, Flint is also dreaming about what could be.

"I don't know if my vision is too big, but I'd like to see a lot more services offered here," he said. But more services would require increased funding for the agency, which has a budget of approximately \$40,000 annually.

Currently, the Multi Agency is a satellite for several social service agencies, including Crosspoint Human Services, Center for Children's Services, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Department of Rehabilitation, CRIS Senior Services, Catholic Social Services, PACE and the Unemployed Workers Discount Program.

Additionally, the agency provides senior citizen transportation, job training referral, energy assistance and the Healthy Mom/Healthy Kids program. Recently, the office added services of the Office of Employment Security to the roster.

Recreational programs include a monthly community potluck and euchre parties.

Flint would like to see services expanded, if possible, something the board is also looking at.

"Over the last year, we've experienced growing pains," Burkett said. "We've spent the last year solidifying the office structure and the infrastructure and now we're going to hold planning sessions to see what can be offered as far as community services."

Flint would like to eventually add shelters for victims of domestic abuse and runaways, but those will not be
