Employer must notify employees of insurance options: lawyer

Editor's Note: The following column, written by Hoopeston attorneys Calvin Hultquist and Kate Giffin, appears as space allows.

When an event occurs which will result in a person losing coverage under a group health plan sponsored by an employer, federal law requires the employer to notify Spea that person in writing of their eligibility to continue coverage under the health plan.

The person covered by the plan may then elect to continue coverage for 180 days; however, the covered person would have to pay both the employee's and employer's shares of the cost of such coverage.

If an employer fails to notify the employee or dependent of that right, the employer can be held responsible for all the person's medical expenses (less what the premiums would have been) occurring during that 180-day period. Events terminating coverage and kicking this federal law into effect

include: voluntary or involuntary termination (except for the

employee's **severe** misconduct); divorce or legal separation of the covered employee from his/her spouse; death of the covered employee; or a dependent child turning 18. For example, if an employee dies, the employer must notify the employee's spouse and dependents of their right to continue health coverage, or be held liable.

This federal law applies only to employers of 20 or more persons, but applies to employees, their spouses and dependents.

Employers should make it a practice to provide this notice to all employees in writing to avoid being held liable for medical expenses. For more details, employer and employees should talk to their attorneys.
