Hoopeston library ready to merge onto information highway

July 16 will be an important date in the history of the Hoopeston Public Library.

That is the date when the library will start to enter information to become part of the LINC, the on-line catalog of the Lincoln Trails Libraries System.

Library employees will now spend approximately one year entering information on what is offered at the local library, as well as a list of patrons, said head librarian Lou Graham.

Graham made the announcement at Monday's Community Involvement Committee meeting.

Library patrons will receive new, bar-coded library cards to go with the new system, Graham said. Patrons may use the new cards at any Lincoln Trails library.

Graham is excited about going on-line. "It's something I've looked forward to for a long time," she said.

In other news from the library, Graham said longer Saturday hours may be offered later this year.

A survey of patrons, done in March and April, showed that while most patrons "wouldn't change a

thing, a few suggested longer hours on Saturday," Graham said.

A plan for more hours is expected to be completed soon after Labor Day, she said.

Graham also spoke about the summer reading club, which is in its last week. More than 250 children participated in the program, which will end Friday with a 2 p.m. puppet show at the McFerren Park Civic Center.

The public is invited to the show.

Also, Graham said, Dr. Darrel Good, University of Illinois agriculture economist, will present a grain marketing seminar at the library at 10 a.m. Aug. 9. The seminar is co-sponsored by the library and Demeter Inc.


