MILFORD—A local girl has been named 1996 Miss Iroquois County Fair.
Jamie Lavicka, 20, daughter of Jack and Jackie Lavicka of rural Milford, was crowned Wednesday night, said pageant director Leslie Goslin of Gibson City.
Stacy Hansen of Clifton was first runner up and Samantha Sutfin of Watseka was second runner up. Miss Congeniality honors went to Sutfin and Robin Miller of Sheldon.
Lavicka, an Eastern Illinois University senior, majors in premed/zoology. She is a graduate of Milford High School and Parkland College, which she attended on a full athletic scholarship and was co-captain of the basketball team.
Lavicka works at the Milford swimming pool, where she coaches the local swim team.
Lavicka was one of a field of seven candidates for the title. She, along with two others, were contestants in last year's competition. "She didn't place last year, but she came back this year and just wowed them," Goslin said.

Thirty five percent of judging is based on interview, with another 25 percent based on communications skills. Additionally, 20 percent of the total is stage presence/evening gown and the remaining 20 percent is based on beauty of face and physical condition.
