Swimmers to pool in Hoopeston for conference meet

Nearly 400 swimmers will converge on Hoopeston Saturday for the annual Central Conference Swim Meet.

Nine teams are expected to compete, said Joanne Bibb, Hoopeston Swim Team coach. Represented will be the Elks Country Club and Vermilion Hills Country Club, both of Danville, Milford, Paxton, Gibson City, Rantoul, Monticello, Urbana Country Club and Hoopeston.

Swimmers will be divided according to age and swimming stroke. Age classifications include under 8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, and 15-18, while individual competition strokes include freestyle, breast stroke, butterfly and back stroke, Bibb said.

Preliminary rounds, with three heats for each race, begin at 9 a.m. Saturday and should be completed by 1 p.m. After an hour break, finals will begin, followed by freestyle relays.

Swimmers in the top 6 places will receive medals, while the top 4 teams will take home trophies. Three teams tied with dual meet scores - Paxton, Monticello and Vermilion Hills - are competing for possession of the conference traveling trophy.

This is the second consecutive year Hoopeston has hosted the conference meet, Bibb said.

Like last year, the Hoopeston Lions Club will open its food stand for the meet. The Hoopeston Rotary Club will also sell ice cream during the competition.
