U of I professor to address farmers at grain marketing seminar

Will beans hit an all time high, or will there be short beans with high prices?

At 9 a.m. Aug. 9, Dr. Darrel Good will give an overview of current grain markets at the Hoopeston Public Library.

Good is a professor and extension economist in the Department of Agricultural Economics at the University of Illinois.

Good will speak, then take questions, such as:

Will there be an early or a late frost?

Will there be a short yield?

Will crop quality be acceptable to the end user?

Dare we forward price this crop with all these possible scenarios that could happen in the next 10 to 12 weeks?

Good has co-authored a textbook on price forecasting and sales management and is a major author of the "Weekly Outlook" and "Grain Price Outlook" newsletters. He has written numerous articles and bulletins on price forecasting, outlook and the development of marketing strategies.

An Illinois native, Good received his B.S. and M.S. degrees from southern Illinois University and his Ph. D. from Michigan State University.

Prior to joining the University of Illinois in 1976, he was assistant professor of agricultural economics at Cornell University.

The meeting, co-sponsored by the library and Demeter Inc., is open to everyone. Refreshments will be provided.

'Use Us' says director of local social service organization

"Use Us" could be the motto of two programs at the Hoopeston Multi Agency Service Center/Community Center.

The center's transportation program and thrift shop are being under-used according to Chalmers Flint, agency executive director.

"We need some riders," Flint said of the transportation program.

The agency uses a handicapped-accessible van to take senior citizens to doctor's visits, shopping trips, or just visiting friends, said Susan Redden, Multi Agency office

manager.

The agency offers a van shuttle service throughout Hoopeston on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Time-temp may keep agency wheels turning

A time and temperature service may be reactivated in Hoopeston, a way to raise money for the Multi Agency's transportation project.

Agency director Chalmers Flint said the agency may offer the service if enough businesses or organizations can be found to fund it.

Flint wants to find 10 sponsors to fund the service at \$100 per month. For that, sponsors will receive rotating 10-second advertisements followed by the current time and temperature reading.

Half the money raised would pay for telephone service while the other half would go to the agency to fund programs.

Flint has six "pretty solid" sponsors lined up but is seeking more. Any group interested in participating should call the Multi Agency at (217) 283-



Wednesdays and Fridays, the van makes trips to Danville, Champaign or Lafayette, Ind. Special trips are also made to area plays and other activities.

Additionally, senior citizens or others who require transportation not on the van's schedule may request volunteer drivers.

Under this component of the transportation project, volunteers drive area residents to doctor or other appointments, "especially in emergency situations," Redden said.

The Multi Agency funds the transportation program through two main sources: donations and grants from agencies including the East Central Illinois Area Agency on Aging and the Grant Township United Way.

Suggested donations are \$1 for the Hoopeston shuttle, \$2 for trips to Rossville, \$5 for Danville trips and \$10 for Champaign excursions and social trips.

Those who cannot afford the suggested amounts will not be banned from the bus, however. "If they don't have any money, they can ride for free," Flint said. "You're still welcome to ride the van."

Transportation grants received by the agency are often the matching fund kind, where the Multi Agency must match the amount of the grant, or lose

part of the money.

That is where the thrift shop comes in, as a means of raising money to keep the van's wheels rolling.

The shop, located in the rear of the agency's headquarters at 206 S. First Ave., is open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday-Friday both for shoppers and those who wish to donate items.

Items accepted at the thrift shop include clothing in good repair, knick-knacks, working lamps and televisions, and furniture such as coffee tables and end tables.

"If they have those items around the house that they're going to pitch anyway, we'd appreciate it if they'd bring them up here," Flint said.
