# **Resident can't raise roof yet as city stalls barn request**

A Hoopeston man will have to wait for a while to raise the roof - of a new pole barn.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston city council meeting, Alderman Dave Borders said Don Jeffers of 903 E. McNeil, requested a variance to build a pole barn with a 13.4-foot peak.

City ordinance limits outbuildings to a maximum of 10 feet.

Borders supported Jeffers' request, telling aldermen the man wanted the barn to house his mobile home. Borders explained that Jeffers lives in a sparsely populated area of the city and that two adjacent neighbors had no complaints about the planned barn.

However, city attorney Jim Spiros said that unless aldermen wanted to change the maximum height in the ordinance, Jeffers would have to put his request before the city plan commission.

Jeffers will take his request through proper channels. No date has been set for the plan commission hearing.

In unrelated business, Alderman Drew Allen said televised inspections of problem sewer areas has been completed and a solution to those problems should be coming soon.

Allen said two options exist for repairing troublesome sewers, especially those on Young Ave.

First, he said, workers could bore out the line, which would require replacing taps to each home along the line.

The second option is to replace the existing line, which Allen favors, although cost estimates have not yet come in. "We should have all the information by the next meeting," he said.

In other business, the city is accepting bids to sell a 1982 Ford F250 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-ton pickup truck and a 1967 Dodge 300.

Both can be seen at the Main Street water department office.


