

Family turns tragedy into good fortune for cancer group

ROSSVILLE—A local family has turned their sorrow into a fun-filled fundraiser for the Vermilion County chapter of the American Cancer Society.

The Larry Claypool Classic, a women's softball tournament, will be held Aug. 17 and 18 at Rossville's Chrisman Park.

This is the competition's seventh year. It started when friends and family of Larry Claypool decided to hold an event that would raise money to help defray the Rossville man's battle with cancer.

Mr. Claypool, a Rossville truck driver, was diagnosed with colon cancer in the early 1980s. The disease went into remission following chemotherapy. In 1988, a follow-up blood test revealed no cancer. "Eight weeks later to the day, everything went berserk," said Madelyn Claypool, Mr. Claypool's widow.

The cancer had returned with a vengeance, spreading to Mr. Claypool's lungs and tailbone.

When Mr. Claypool died at age 52 in December 1989, organizers decided to memorialize him by continuing the tournament, said Madelyn Claypool, Mr. Claypool's widow.

men's competition in Penfield, has evolved into a women's tournament in Rossville, Mrs. Claypool said.

When the tournament moved to Rossville, it featured both men's and women's games. The women played at Chrisman Park while the men played at the Rossville Alvin High School field. "We tried to be both places at once, but it was unreal," Mrs. Claypool said.

The women's tournament drew a larger crowd. because players' families would accompany them, so the Claypool family decided to turn the Classic into a female affair.

Over the years, children's activities have been added, including face-painting by clowns, and children's games at 25 cents each. "Those girls bring their families, so you've got to have something for the kids to do," Mrs. Claypool said.

- ran the event with the help of friends. But two years ago, after the children had grown and gone, Mrs. Claypool was faced with the daunting challenge of organizing the event by herself. "It was a lot of work," she said.

When the Vermilion County Chapter of the American Cancer Society formed in February 1995, Mrs. Claypool approached them about taking on the tournament. The group agreed and the event has since become the organization's single largest fundraiser.

In 1994, Claypool's solo effort raised \$4,000 to fund cancer research and increase public awareness. Last year, the total jumped to \$6,000 because, Claypool said, the Cancer Society is able to draw bigger sponsors than the small band of organizers could.

This year's Classic will begin at 8 a.m. each day. Play is expected to end at 8 p.m. each night.

Each of the eight teams competing is guaranteed four games each. The winning team will take home \$150, while second place finishers will receive \$100.
