Senate hopeful stops in Hoopeston as part of state-wide campaign

What looked like a family gathering at Hoopeston's McFerren Park Monday was actually a

political rally for the Republican candidate for U.S. Senate. Al Salvi, accompanied by his wife, Kathy, and five children, stopped in Hoopeston, part of

1,000-mile family caravan. "I'm not just pontificating on the issues," Salvi told approximately 20 people who gathered to hear him. "We're having a lot of fun."

SALVI Salvi, a two-term State representative from Wauconda, is seeking the seat being vacated by retiring Democratic Sen. Paul Simon.

The candidate spoke briefly about his platform. which includes lower taxes and reduced government spending. "We want to make sure your children and grandchildren have the same opportunities you did," he said. "Experts predict the next generation will be the first generation to have a lower standard of living than their parents did."

Salvi said that while government is taxing more, it also is spending more, creating a bigger debt. "Government should be at our side, not on our back," he said.

Salvi blasted his Democratic opponent, Richard Durbin, saying Durbin "has never voted no on a tax increase."

Those attending, many of whom wore stickers for the candidate, were encouraged to take pre-printed postcards to send to friends later in the campaign. "Get out your Christmas card list a little early," Salvi said. "We'd like hundreds of thousands of postcards to reach people the last two weeks of the campaign."

Salvi, a self-described "a mainstream candidate" also favors term limits, a line item veto, balanced budge amendment and requiring welfare workers to work for benefits.

According to information provided by the campaign, he also favors the death penalty and requiring inmates to serve at least 85 percent of their sentences.

Stretch of Route 1 in Iroquois County to get needed repairs

Route 1 from Milford south to the Iroquois County line has been awarded.

State Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) and State Sen. Harry "Babe" Woodyard (R-Chrisman) announced the contract last week.

The \$3,921,000 contract covers total renovation of the road, including a new highway surface and extensive shoulder work.

"This portion of Route 1 in Iroquois County is in desperate need of construction," Black said.

"The three bridges along this 10.8 mile portion were reconstructed two years ago, so a new highway surface will complete long-overdue construction of this important north-south state highway," Woodyard said.
