Congress has good year says local U.S. representative

Welfare reform and health care legislation will help American citizens, according to a U.S. Representative.

"I'm pleased with the progress Congress has made," said U.S. Rep. Tom Ewing, (R-Pontiac).

Ewing was in Hoopeston Thursday, on one of several stops in Vermilion County.

Welfare reform - giving states the power to oversee taking care of their poor - was needed, Ewing said, because existing welfare policy "traps people in a system they just can't get out of."

New guidelines will "help people when they're down and out but won't make addicted," he said.

Asked how Illinois will handle its welfare program, Ewing said he believes time limits will be placed on recipients and that decisions must be made whether increased benefits will be paid to those who have more children while on welfare and whether to pay teen par-

ents. "In cities, (welfare) is a way for teens to get their own apartments," he said.

Changes will also crack down on dead-beat dads, "getting touch on able-bodied guys who leave the female and the child and walk off like they have no responsibility," Ewing said.

As for health care reform, legislation recently signed by President Clinton gives the assurance that care is available through job loss and in the event of preexisting conditions. Changes in spending on such programs have resulted in savings which can be applied to the deficit, Ewing said. "There's a new spotlight on cutting spending," he said. "We're all kind of singing on the wrong page if we don't get our financial house in order."

Ewing said there is some resistance to a balanced budget amendment, but that the amendment is something Americans want. Without spending cuts

"there's a \$5 trillion debt we're going to give to our children and that's unconscionable," he said.

Ewing fielded questions from residents on topics including medical benefits for retired military personnel, immigration and the Middle Fork reservoir project.
