Bond set at \$500,000 for man arrested on drug charges

A Hoopeston man arrested Wednesday on drug charges was being held in the Vermilion County jail on \$500,000 bond.

Valentin Torres, 34, of 905 S. Second Ave., is charged with delivery of cannabis, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine) and narcotics racketeering.

While arresting Torres, Vermilion County Metropolitan Enforcement Group (VMEG) agents seized approximately \$24,000. An additional \$7,500 was later seized.

Torres appeared Thursday before Judge Joseph Moore who set Torres' bond. Torres must post \$50,000 to be released.

Charges against Torres include a class 1 felony (narcotics racketeering), punishable by four to 15 years imprisonment; a class 2 felony (delivery of cannabis), punishable by three to seven years; and a class X felony (delivery of a controlled substance), punishable by nine
