History of Sweetcorn Festival dates back to late 1930s

Event grows from local festival to one with national appeal

The founders of the Sweetcorn Festival must surely be amazed at the evolution their festival has undergone in 53 years.

Hoopeston busienssmen originated the festival in 1938 to celebrate the end of the sweet corn-canning season., The festival was held over a three-day weekend in the downtown business district.

As is common to most area festivals, a pageant was held to name a local girl to reign over the festivities.

The first year, the girl was chosen by votes of festival-goers. In 1939, however, local judges were responsible for the selection of the Sweetcorn Queen.

In 1940, canning and canning-related industries in Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, Ohio, Iowa and Wisconsin sent representatives to vie for the title.

has judged numerous local, state and national talent competitions and pageants.

Dennis Wall, a Milwaukee high school English teacher. Wall, who has had formal training in music, has directed local pageants in the Milwaukee area and has judged preliminary pageants in Wisconsin, Iowa, Illinois, Arizona and Florida, and the state pageant in Indiana.

He is currently field director for the Miss Wisconsin pageant and helps in preparing girls for the Miss America pageant.

Since the pageant and festival now had contestants from several states, the name was changed in 1941 from Hoopeston Sweetcorn Festival to the National Sweetcorn Festival. "Miss Sweetcorn" became the National Sweetheart.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce took over responsibility for the festival and pageant following World War II. Their leadership continues today.

The same basic format for the pageant was followed until 1952, when first runners up from various states' Miss America system pageants were invited to compete. At the same time, judges from the Miss America system were recruited to judge the pageant.

As in the Miss America pageant, local winners are awarded scholarships. The National Sweetheart winner receives a \$1,000 scholarship from the Hoopeston Jaycees and a \$200 scholarship from Prairie Farms.

This year's first runner rup receives a \$300 scholarship from Silgan Containers and a \$125 scholarship from Prairie Farms.

Second runner up receives a \$200 scholarship from the Hoopeston Jaycees. The third runner up receives a \$50 scholarship and fourth runner up receives a \$25 scholarship, both from Prairie Farms.
