Judicial candidate addresses need for county judge to be elected

The recently-created judgeship in the Fifth Judicial Circuit should be filled by a Vermilion County judge.

That was the message that Daniel Brown, Danville attorney and candidate for the seat, brought to the Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch Monday.

Vermilion County, Brown said, has the highest number of trials in the Fifth Circuit, which also includes Coles, Cumberland, Clark and Edgar counties.

In 1995, he said, Vermilion County had 601 of the 1,195 criminal felony cases filed in the circuit.

Vermilion County also had 47 percent of the divorce and civil cases and 16,000 of 31,000 traffic/misdemeanor filings.

Circuit court cases are heard by nine circuit and associate judges in the Fifth Circuit. Those judges do not hear cases outside their home counties unless given specific appointments by the chief circuit judge, Brown said.

Of the nine judges, six are in Vermilion County, but more are needed for the increasing caseload, Brown said

Brown said, adding that if he is elected, he will hold trial in Vermilion County, while his opponent will hold court in his home county of Edgar.

While more money is spent on adding police officers and building prisons, "we're still trying to funnel everything through the same number of (judges)," Brown said. "We can't hear everything that's been filed."

A large number of those cases involve juveniles, Brown said, adding he does not have an answer for that problem. "If I did, I wouldn't be running for judge, I'd be running for something more lucrative," he said.

Brown is running for a new judgeship, created by

legislation sponsored by state Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville).

Black had wanted his legislation to create a new judgeship in Vermilion County, but through an error, the legislation allowed a new seat in the entire circuit, Brown said.

Brown said his experience makes him the most qualified candidate for the seat. He has had his own practice for the past 13 years. He has also worked in the
