### Hoopeston library one of five to get on-line with state grant

Patrons of four area libraries will be able to travel in cyberspace next year, thanks to a state grant.

The libraries, in Hoopeston, Cissna Park, Watseka and Sheldon, and the Central Citizens Library District in Clifton will receive \$88,000 to establish a link between the communities and to the Internet, said Lou Graham, Hoopeston Public Library head librarian.

Graham made the announcement at Monday's Community Involvement Committee meeting.

Four of the sites - Hoopeston, Cissna Park, Watseka and Clifton - will have servers, computers that can be accessed by people with other computers, Graham said.

The program is designed to "create a presence for this area in cyberspace," Graham said. "We will offer unique community information."

Graham stressed the program is not designed to compete with businesses providing Internet service, but rather to provide information on each of the communities. And when a person reaches a site about one of the communities, he will automatically receive information on the others.

At least during the grant phase of the project, local residents with home computers will be able to use the program because the grant will pay for several modems to connect users to the Internet.

That may change when grant money is exhausted and the library becomes financially responsible for the entire program, Graham said.

Designed to help participating libraries, the program may benefit host communities, as well. "I would like to think it's going to make a difference in economic development," Graham said.

Businesses and organizations in each of the communities will be encouraged to create home pages, computer pages that contain information about the business or

group. To make that happen, the library will sponsor some type of educational program on creating home pages, Graham said.

Installation on the system is expected to begin in February.

In other community news, some Hoopeston Area grade school students are getting extra help with their homework and earning a little extra money, as well.


