They stood there, eight officers in they saluted the man uniform. As one, they saluted the man who had been their leader for 35 years.

And when they were done, there was not a dry eye in the house.

That was the scene Friday afternoon as members of the Hoopeston Police Department said good-bye to Chief Orval Kaag.

Kaag, touched by the display, shook each officer's hand, hugged some, then walked away to compose himself before returning to the group.


