Alderman withdraws objection to commission naming new chief

A Hoopeston alderman has withdrawn his objections to the police commission hiring a new police chief.

Alderman Dave Borders had expressed strong objections to the commission naming a new chief, citing the importance of the job and the lack of input

from the council in making the decision.

At the Jan. 21 council meeting. Borders requested, then retracted a change in the ordinance, allowing the council to approve the new chief.

However, after meeting with the commission Tuesday, Borders has withdrawn his objections.

Borders met with the threemember commission before they

went into executive session to discuss applicants for the police chief's job.

"I'm very confident in them after talking to them," he said. "They just really impressed me. They had some of the same concerns as I've had."

Those concerns, he said, include finding a chief who will have a positive public image and who will "be a disciplinary person," Borders said.

Borders said he was assured by commission members that input from the city's police committee

> is welcome. Borders said he will be satisfied with committee input. "There's no need for the whole council to sit through 20 applications," he said.

Borders said his questioning of the commission's ability to select a new chief was wrong, especially in light of the fact that he had not talked with commission members. "(The commission's) complaint

us," he said. "It was my lack of talking to people. I think I was worrying for nothing."

Rossville police officials to take time replacing officer

ROSSVILLE—It will be approximately two months before Rossville officials fill a full-time police officer's position.

The position became open Jan. 1 with the resignation of Terry McCord, said police chief Paul Dewitt.

We're not going to fill the position right away," Dewitt said. "Our part-timers will work more hours than normal."

Village officials and Dewitt will work together to find a new officer, who, like McCord, will work under Cops Fast, a federal program that pays the majority of the officer's salary.

The village applied for and received a \$65,000 grant, good for three years, Dewitt said. The money is used, in part, to pay approximately 75 percent of a full-time officer's salary. "It's a good program for places like Rossville," Dewitt said. "It's only costing the village about \$1.76 an hour to put a man on the streets."

The village requests money from the program every two months, so while officials look for a new
