Local Scout troop to name first Eagle Scout in 15 years

One young man's dedication to an organization will be rewarded Sunday.

Brian DeNeal, 18, will receive the highest award given by the Boy Scouts when he becomes an Eagle Scout at a ceremony Sunday.

The ceremony will begin at 2 p.m. at St. Anthony's parish hall, 313 E. Lincoln, said assistant Scout master Tom Kasallis.

DeNeal, son of Dan and Gloria DeNeal of Hoopeston, is the first Scout to attain Eagle status in 15 years. "He's been working on it since he was 11," Kasallis said. "He's shown a lot of commitment and put forth a lot of hard work."

Eagle Scout status is not easy to achieve, Kasallis said. As boys get older, they become involved in more things, often leaving less time for Scouts. "A lot of times, when you get into high school, you're forced to make choices," Kasallis said. "(DeNeal's) stuck it out."

The Scout must complete seven ranks and earn a specified number of merit badges and perform service projects, demonstrating not only service to the Scouts, church, school or community, but also leadership of

other Scouts.

For one of his service projects, DeNeal created first aid kits for his church, then placed maps around the building marking where each kit was located, Kasallis said.

Finally, the young man must be interviewed by an Eagle board of review, made up of Scout officials not affiliated with the potential Eagle's troop.

DeNeal almost didn't make his dream, said Kasallis, also an Eagle Scout. Scouts can only earn rank until their 18th birthday. DeNeal, who turned 18 on Nov. 8, received his award just a week before his birthday. "He needed a little encouragement before he got it," Kasallis said.

The Eagle Scout rank is something men are proud of their whole lives, Kasallis said. Hoopeston's Boy Scout troop 138 has an application from astronaut Joe Tanner when he applied to be an Eagle Scout. "(Tanner) still lists Eagle Scout as one of his accomplishments." Kasallis said.

The ceremony for DeNeal is open to the public.




Funds will be disbursed throughout the year, said United Way vice president Chalmers Flint.


