Lost socks, other items find Keepers in new Hoopeston business

You know those socks that always get lost in the laundry?

They have a Keeper.

So does the nursery, faith, love, birthdays, bears, kitchens and trails, among others.

In fact, those are just a few of the things with Keepers, said Sandra Drullinger.

Drullinger and her husband, Paul, recently opened For Keeps, a shop primarily for Keepers.

Keepers are collectibles featuring little men with red hair and eyebrows who look after things such as the laundry, trails and love.

For example, the Keeper of the Laundry has a bagful of those socks lost in the laundry. The Keeper of Time has a pocket watch and clock with wings.

For Keeps has a full line of the collectibles and specially-designed shelves to display them.

The store resulted from Drullinger's collection of Keepers, which she first found while at a country music show in Indiana. "I saw the Keeper of the Kitchen and fell in love with it," she said. "My husband got it for me."

When she got that Keeper home, Drullinger contacted the manufacturer, Shenandoah Designs International of Rural Retreat, Va., for more.

She then attended a gift show in Atlanta and ordered still more. "Next thing we knew, we said we're going to have a place to store all these things," Drullinger said.

Needing a storage place turned into the idea for the store. "It all started with this one little Keeper," she said.

Drullinger is not the only one collecting Keepers. Shenandoah Designs, which was created five years ago, now sells Keepers not only in the U.S., but in 15 other countries, as well.

Each Keeper is limited to 10,000 pieces. After that many are created, the piece is retired. Those retired pieces then appreciate in value.

For example, the Christmas 1995 Keeper is retired and is now worth \$400, "if you can find one," Drullinger said.

The business offers other collectible and gift items, including scented candles, coaster sets, china and Bradford baskets.

For Keeps will also carry crystal, desk sets and music boxes, expected to arrive shortly, Drullinger said.

Contributing author to appear at Danville Public Library



America, a group of volunteers who teach adults to


