## HA residents will have chance to visit information superhighway

Residents of the Hoopeston Area school district will be able to find spots of interest along the information superhighway beginning next month.

At Thursday's school board meeting, Superintendent Don Dean announced that the high school's 32-computer lab will be open to the public for 10 consecutive Mondays beginning March 24.

Two sessions are scheduled each week, the first beginning at 6 p.m. followed by a second at 7 p.m. High school teachers and students will be on hand to help computer users, Dean said.

The sessions are free and are on a first-come, first-served basis. More information is available by calling the school at (217) 283-6662.

Dean said future uses of the lab may include formal training in Web page design for businesses and industry, as well as training in marketing individual businesses on the Internet.

In other action, the board:

□approved applying for an \$87,000 federal grant for a

summer migrant program which will start in July. The grant is based on 140 students, said program director Quentin Ryder, adding last year's enrollment was 128, down from 137 the previous year.

□approved ceding five acres of land in the northwest corner of the district to the Cissna Park district. Property owner Glenn Berg requested the change to allow his children to attend Cissna Park schools. Berg cited the land's proximity to Cissna Park as the reason, Dean said.

□learned the Vermilion County Health Department will provide hepatitis B immunizations to fourth graders and pre-kindergarten students. The three-shot series will given March 6, April 3 and Aug. 7 at the Presbyterian Church, 915 E. Orange, Dean said.

Charge for the immunization is \$18 for the series.

□approved rehiring all principals and the director of building and grounds.

□accepted Brian Hodge's resignation as middle school boys' basketball coach, effective at the end of this year.

## Keith to be third ward write-in candidate in April election

Ward 3 voters will have a third choice in the April 1 election.

Jeff Keith, 34, said filed to be a write-in candidate on the ballot because "it's time for a change."

Keith will face incumbent Drew Allen and newcomer Cliff Witty.

City government is not working properly, Keith said. "They just seem to be passing the buck from one department to another," he said. "There's a lack of communication between the council and the council and the voters."

Also, Keith said, aldermen seem to be in a hurry to leave council meetings. "They're in and out of

council and it's zippity-do-dah and they're gone," he said.

Keith's platform, if elected, will be civic improvements, including getting grants and low-interest loans for the city, changing voter apathy, getting results for resident complaints and protecting the local environment.

The life-long Hoopeston resident said he will bring a new outlook to the council and is running because "I owe (Hoopeston) anything that I can return to it."

The ability to stick to his convictions is another asset Keith said he will bring to the office, but said he is willing to work with other aldermen to


