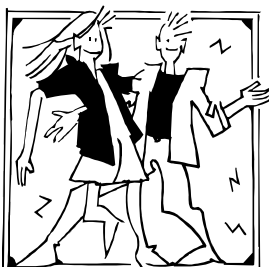

Selling old items leads to buying new ones for RA schools

ROSSVILLE—Something old will be used for something new at Rossville-Alvin schools.

This weekend's 31st annual Antique Show and Sale, sponsored by the Rossville-Alvin Boosters, will benefit the group, which provides sports equipment and other items for Rossville-Alvin students, said Booster president Mike Porter.

Approximately 50 dealers from Indiana, the Chicago area and southern Illinois are expected to be on hand offering "a very wide variety of antiques," Porter said. Books, classic toys, dishes and jewelry will all be for sale at the event.

This is Porter's second year as Booster president and second year at the show. The event has given him a new perspective on antiques. "I'm not interested antiques myself," he said, "but I've

become interested in seeing what's available here."

This is also Porter's second year working with event manager Naomi Freeman. "She's really a jewel," he said.

The Boosters spend a little money to make money on the show. Dealers will set up their wares Friday night and will be treated to a complimentary dinner hosted by the Boosters, Porter said. The club also pays for night time security guards at the high school.

In return, Boosters will receive all money from concessions, plus a portion of each booth rental and door fees. Last year, the club received between \$4,000 and \$5,000 from the show. "This is our big money-maker for the year," Porter said. "For just two days, that's not bad."

Proceeds from the event are used predominantly for sports equipment. Two years ago, the Boosters purchased new high school baseball uniforms and last year, bought uniforms for the girls' softball team, Porter said. This year, money is slated to help pay for a \$1,500 weight machine, he added. The club also helps pay for meals when teams travel to special events.

Porter would not be averse to seeing some of the

money used for areas other than sports. "To me, if a spelling bee wanted money, I wouldn't turn them down," he said. "I personally don't want to see it limited to athletics because more than athletes and their families contribute to it."

The show will be held from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday at the Rossville-Alvin High School gym. Admission is \$2.50.

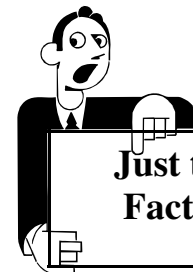
