Township food cupboard may be hit by welfare changes

Changes in welfare laws may have a big impact on the Grant Township Food Cupboard.

More changes, effective July 1, will limit people to lifetime benefits of five years, said cupboard president Alta Goodrum at Monday's Community Involvement Committee meeting.

"We don't know how this is going to affect us," she said. "I think the need is going to be greater at that time."

Hardest hit may be able-bodied single people ages 18 to 55, who will be limited to three years of benefits, three months at a time, she said. "We're going to have to

figure out some way to help them."

The food cupboard board will discuss how to meet the changes, as well as whether the group should request donations of personal items, such as laundry and bath soap and shampoo, she said.

Needs at the pantry this month include peanut butter, applesauce, cake mixes and any kind of canned fruit.
