knowledge of equipment and water supply, Mikel said.

Ratings are then used by insurance companies to establish premiums for residences, businesses and industry.

The new rating will affect all buildings in the village limits as well as structures outside the limits but within 1,000 feet of a Rossville fire hydrant.

Rossville joins a select group communities with a five rating. In Vermilion County, only Danville and Catlin have similar ratings, he said.
