### Hardware store to move to new location later this year

Dave and Barb Powley plan to spend more time listening to train whistles, and they hope others will join them.

The couple, owners of Ace Hardware, will relocate the store to the corner of South Second Avenue and Route 9, next to the railroad tracks.

The land had been owned by Hoopeston Foods Inc. and is the former site of barracks for guards watching W.W.II prisoners of war.

Construction of the new building is expected to be complete by the end of the summer, Mr. Powley said.

The Powleys hope other businesses will join them at the location. "I would like not be alone," Powley said.
