City council expected to vote on no-frills 1997 budget Tuesday

The Hoopeston city council will vote Tuesday on a no-frills budget.

The city's finance committee met with the full council Wednesday night to plan the final 1997 budget, which includes no major one-time purchases, said Alderman Bill Goodwine, budget committee chairman.

Original budget requests submitted by each department totalled \$48,000 more than projected revenue, Goodwine said. At Wednesday's meeting, council members approved a one-year moratorium on one-time purchases.

Eliminated from the budget were two tractors for the street/alley department, lawn mowers, \$10,000 in playground equipment for parks, another \$10,000 for plotting the new part of Floral Hill Cemetery, \$12,500 for a new city sign and landscaping and \$25,000 for a tractor mower.

The total of cut items, approximately \$167,000, will

be used to eliminate the \$48,000 deficit in original requests. Additionally, money will be set aside to purchase new tractors, a tractor mower and future swimming pool repairs and civic improvements.

Approximately \$22,000 of the savings is earmarked to repair sidewalks on the north side of the 200 block of East Main Street, "because that's a safety thing," he said.

Although departments will not get everything requested, Goodwine said by putting money aside, the city will save large interest payments. "It's like the family who's got kids and don't put any money away for college or to fix the refrigerator or any of 10 other appliances," he said. "We're trying to plan ahead and avoid those big interest payments. Everybody agreed we could live without these items."

A final budget amount will not be available until prior to Tuesday's meeting. The 1996 budget was \$6,450,354
