Rossville-Alvin considers combining sixth grade classes

ROSSVILLE—The Rossville-Alvin school board is considering a plan which would make one sixth grade class next year.

The proposal was discussed at Monday's district school board meeting.

Currently, 24 students are in the class which will be sixth graders next year, said Superintendent Phil Smith.

The board is studying whether to combine both classes into one, cutting the cost of a teacher, despite parent comments criticizing the proposal, Smith said.

A combined class, program cuts, as well as a decision last month to hire a high school principal next year, were criticized by parents and teachers at Monday's meeting Recent cuts have included a scaled-back art program, offered in grades six through 12; reduction of a full-time librarian to one hour per day, the elimination of a Title 1 teacher, eliminating a \$10,000 matching grant for an accelerated reading program and the honorable dismissal of two teachers at the end of this school year.

In other business, the board accepted the resignation of board member Steve Winegardner. Winegardner cited personal reasons in his resignation, which is effective immediately.
