Hoopeston Area class of 1998 plan memorial to classmates

Hoopeston Area High School's class of 1998 is planning a memorial and are asking for contributions from the community.

The memorial is for Doug Layden and Angela Epps who were killed in a car accident on Oct. 31, 1996.

The memorial will be erected in front of the high school where benches are currently placed, said Hoopeston Area district secretary Betty Richards.

Students plan to have a cement block laid in the area. The block will have a cutout for the memorial and shrubbery. Benches will border two sides of the memorial and red oak trees will also be planted.

The memorial is designed to be a meeting place for students before school, during lunch and after school.

Even with donated materials, the cost exceeded expectations, so class members, who need \$2,000 to \$3,000, are seeking contributions from the community.

Babies' arrival scheduled for Tuesday at local restaurant

Instead of waiting nine months for a new baby to arrive, area residents have only to wait until Tuesday.

Nine of the 10 toys will be available. The local store will not have Chocolate Moose, but will have the goldfish, turtle, platypus, flamingo, lamb, lizard, duck, bull and seal

If next week's shipment is anything like the last group of toys, they will not last long. A set of 1,200 disappeared in four hours last week, Rhodes said.

Toys were included free in children's Happy Meals and were available for \$1.49 with a food purchase of \$1.20 or more.

Next week, the toys will be in Happy Meals. Children

may purchase up to three additional toys with additional food purchases of \$1.20 or more.


Collection times will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday and 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday.
