Officer recognized for apprehending drunk drivers

A Hoopeston police officer was honored Tuesday night for his efforts in making city streets safer.

At Tuesday's Hoopeston city council meeting, Officer Roger Beaty received a certificate from the Alliance Against Intoxicated Motorists, crediting him with having a majority of the department's arrests for driving under the influence of alcohol.

"It's not very often that an officer gets recognized," said Chief Carl Valentine before presenting Beaty with the certificate. "It's a good thing for Roger. DUI is a thing that's definitely a problem. It does save lives."

In other business, Valentine told the council that he has divided the city into zones which officers are patrolling for junk cars and tall weeds. "So far, it's

worked out really well," he said. "I think we've sent out 30 to 40 notices so far."

Valentine plans to divide the city into two zones for shift patrols, as well, eliminating officers being in the same place at the same time.


