Landfill company seeks variance to avoid duplicate paperwork

A local landfill company has requested a variance from the Pollution Control Board that will help the company eliminate duplicate paperwork.

Illinois Landfills, a division of Allied Waste Industries and owner of Hoopeston's landfill, on May 16 submitted a petition for variance of waiver of right to public hearing under Title IX of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.

The petition specifically requests a variance from parts of the act requiring an engineering report for upgrading the company's 39-acre site.

The report would be necessary to continue operating the existing site, said Jim Van Weelden of Allied Waste. Although the current permit is valid for approximately three more years, paperwork on renewing the permit would begin about now, he said.

However, information regarding the update is included in the company's application to the state Environmental Protection Agency for a 120-acre expansion, he said.

Van Weelden expects a decision on the application soon. "If we don't have to, we don't want to spend \$200,000 on an engineering report when we should have approval in 60 to 90 days," he said. "We didn't want to do something that's already been done."

Illinois Landfills has worked for approximately five years to get the 120-acre expansion approved.

The issue was approved 5-4 by the Hoopeston city council, but was then stalled by efforts from a local citizens' group.

Group leaders and company officials agreed on compromises, allowing the request to move forward. A new host agreement between the city and company was drawn up, including the compromise items.

Under the host agreement the company will limit to 19 the number of Illinois and Indiana counties from which the expanded landfill will accept waste.

The company also agreed to: freeze garbage rates for 20 years at the rate effective when the new host agreement is used; construct a recycling center at the expanded landfill site; maintain the access road to the site; and monitor wells on property adjacent to the landfill.

Vermilion County Recycling Program to collect white goods

Unwanted white goods will the target of a Vermilion County Recycling Program collection.

Stoves, microwaves, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners and furnaces will be collected June 16-30.

Two collection points have beens set. Coultas Recycling, 123 N. Second St., and Mervis Iron & Metal, 2313 Cannon St., both in Danville, will accept the appliances.

Collection hours at Coultas will be 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday.

At Mervis Iron & Metal, collecting will be done from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. There will be no Saturday hours.

According to the Vermilion County Health Department, many county villages are sponsoring clean-up days and collecting white goods. Those collections are also part of the white goods collection program.

Residents are urged to call mayors or clerks to find out if collections will be held locally this spring.


